Crime(s): Delivery of Methamphetamine, Possession of Methamphetamine, Manufacture of Methamphetamine and Conspiracy to Delivery, Manufacture and Possess Methamphetamine and Felon in Possession of a Firearm.

Narrative: On January 15th 2014 a traffic stop by a Reedsport Police Department Officer resulted in the arrests of Ashley Dawn Gomez and Sergio Llamas-Fernandez and the discovery of about 3.8 pounds of methamphetamine bound for Coos County from Vancouver Washington.

SCINT Detectives were notified and responded to continue the investigation. Continued investigation revealed the methamphetamine was being delivered to a residence in the unincorporated area of Coos Bay commonly referred to as Green Acres.

In the early morning hours of January 16th 2014 SCINT Detectives assisted by, Coos County's Emergency Response Team, Oregon State Police Detectives, Douglas County Interagency Narcotics Team, Coos County Sheriff's Office and Coquille Tribal police officer Robert Scoville and "canine Stormy" executed a search warrant at the residence of Randolph Rossback located at 93615 Upper Loop Road, Coos Bay Oregon.

An additional two ounces of methamphetamine, a firearm, coins, jewelry and over \$21,000.00 in U.S. currency was located during the search of the residence.

Randolph Rossback was arrested on the listed charges and the case has been referred to the Coos County District Attorney's office for prosecution. Ashley Gomez and Sergio Fernandez's case has been referred to the Douglas County District Attorney's Office.

The investigation is continuing and additional arrests are anticipated.
