Myrtle Point Couple Sentenced for Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine.



Coquille, Oregon June 30th, 2014 Scott Fehr and Janette Glenn were each sentenced to 30 days in custody after previously entered guilty pleas.

In January of 2014, through combined efforts, the Myrtle Point and Coquille Police departments obtained a search warrant for a residence in Myrtle Point, Oregon.

SCINT detectives assisted the Myrtle Point and Coquille Police departments with the execution of the search warrant on Maple St in Myrtle Point Oregon. Law enforcement found evidence of distribution that included methamphetamine packaged for individual sale.

It was learned that the owner of the house, Janette Glenn, was living with her boyfriend, Scott Fehr. Glenn indicated in an interview with SCINT detectives she assumed Fehr was dealing drugs and would see packaged mathamphetamine.

In a subsequent interview with Fehr, stated he actually took over selling methamphetamine for Glenn so she would stop. Fehr admitted to detectives he was distributing and would sell to approximately five people.

Fehr and Glenn each plead guilty to one count of Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine. Pursuant to Oregon Sentencing Guidelines, both were sentenced to thirty days in custody and thirty-six months post prison supervision.
