PRESS RELEASE

Meth Dealing Couple Sentenced to 23 Months and 16 Months



Coquille, Oregon on June 16th, Ashley Phillips-Maine was sentenced to twenty-three months in custody after pleading guilty to Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, and Frequenting a Place Where Controlled Substances are Used.

On May 17th, Nicklas Alan Seeley was sentenced to sixteen months in custody after pleading guilty to Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, and Frequenting a Place Where Controlled Substances are Used.

The couple's sentences are based on a Coos County Parole and Probation home visit at 617 S. Wasson Street in Coos Bay Oregon on May 19th, 2014. Upon arrival, probation officers observed probationer Ashley Phillips-Maine run into the residence. Phillips-Maine eventually responded to the door and allowed probation officers entry. Upon entry it was learned, Nicklas Seeley was also a resident of the dwelling.

SCINT is partially funded by the US Department of Justice, Community Oriented Policing Services and the US Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. The funding is provided through the COPS Methamphetamine Initiative (40%) and Congressionally Selected Awards Program (60%).

Methamphetamine paraphernalia was in plain-view. With the assistance of Coos Bay Police, a search of the residence commenced. During that search methamphetamine paraphernalia and marijuana paraphernalia was located throughout the house. In the clothes dryer there was a plastic tote located that contained the implements for drug trafficking in addition to the over 13 grams of methamphetamine located packed for sale.

Former SCINT detective Gil Datan continued the investigation which revealed communications reflecting drug transactions involving methamphetamine and marijuana.

Phillips-Main pleaded guilty to Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine and Frequenting a Place Where Controlled Substances are Used. Based on her criminal history, pursuant to Oregon Sentencing Guidelines, Phillips-Maine was sentenced to a total of twenty-three months in custody followed by thirty-six months post prison supervision.

Seeley pleaded guilty to Unlawful Delivery of Methamphetamine, Unlawful Possession of Methamphetamine, and Frequenting a Place Where Controlled Substances are Used. Pursuant to Oregon Sentencing Guidelines, Seeley was sentenced to a total of sixteen months in custody followed by thirty-six months post prison supervision.
