Crime(s): PCS, DCS, MCS Schedule II – Marijuana, Conspiracy to PCS, DCS, MCS Marijuana, Child Neglect I X2, Endangering the Welfare of a minor X2

Narrative:

On Tuesday October 25, 2011 the South Coast Interagency Narcotics Team (SCINT), Coos County Sheriff's Office, Coquille Police Department and Agents from the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) executed a narcotics search warrant at 90620 Lampa Lane, Myrtle Point, Oregon.

The basis of the search warrant stemmed from the unlawful distribution and sale of approximately 40 pounds of marijuana out of state.

Arrested during the search were two adults. Both were arrested shortly after contact and identified as Dean M. Wilson, 50 YOA and a Michelle E. Wilson, 43 YOA of Myrtle Point. Both were taken into custody and transported to the Coos County Jail and lodged on the above charges.

While at the scene Detectives located an estimated 80 pounds of packaged marijuana bud, over forty pounds of drying marijuana, over \$15,000.00 in US Currency, firearms and drug records.

Some of the packaged marijuana was located buried on the property.

The Child Neglect I charge is based on photographic evidence seized of the minor children involved in the processing of marijuana.

The two minor children 8 and 6 years of age were taken into protective custody.
