NOW BEFORE THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ("Board") sitting for the transaction of County business on April 16, 2024, is the matter of accepting certain rights-of-way proposed to be dedicated or donated pursuant to ORS 368.073(2)(b) for public road purposes; and

WHEREAS, Coos County (the "County") maintains a public road commonly known as the TransPacific Parkway<sup>1</sup> ("TPP") which provides access to the North Bay Marine Industrial Park, railroad facilities, recreational land managed by the U.S. Forest Service and U.S. Bureau of Land Management and other lands on the North Spit, Coos County, Oregon; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Oregon International Port of Coos Bay (the "Port") entered into an intergovernmental agreement ("IGA") dated June 22, 2005, and filed at C&A #105, regarding the TransPacific Parkway Realignment Project ("TPP Realignment Project"), under which the Port made improvements to and realigned a portion of the TPP north of the rail spur; and

WHEREAS, in fulfillment of its obligations under the IGA, the Port constructed the realigned portion of the TPP across temporary construction easements granted by adjoining public and private landowners with the understanding that, upon completion of construction, easements granting permanent rights-of-way benefitting the County would be executed and recorded; and

WHEREAS, the TPP Realignment Project was completed in the fall of 2010 and the TPP in its as-built configuration has been open to public use since that time; and

WHEREAS, Fort Chicago Holdings II U.S., LLC ("FCH") has executed and delivered to the County for acceptance a Public Roadway Easement attached hereto as **Exhibit 1**, granting to the County an easement for public road and utility purposes on and over the lands described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B attached thereto; and

Goergen (collectively, "Goergen") have executed and delivered to the County for acceptance a Public Roadway and Slope Easement attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**, granting to the County an easement for public road and utility purposes on and over the lands described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B attached thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Port has executed and delivered to the County for acceptance a Rail Crossing Easement Agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit 3**, granting to the County an easement to maintain and use a road upon and across the railway property described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B attached thereto; and

WHEREAS, the United States of America, acting by and through the United States Forest Service, a federal agency within the Department of Agriculture, has executed and delivered to the County for acceptance a Public Road Easement attached hereto as **Exhibit 4**, granting to the County an easement for a public road and highway along and across the property described in Exhibit A and depicted in Exhibit B attached thereto; and

WHEREAS, the above documents were provided to the County by the Port in satisfaction of its obligations under Section 1.h of the IGA, as amended, and the County is obligated to accept the same under Section 2.c of the IGA; and

NOW BEFORE THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ("Board") sitting for the transaction of County business on April 16, 2024, is the matter of initiating procedures to vacate certain portions of Jordan Cove Road and the TransPacific Parkway;

WHEREAS, Coos County (the "County") is the beneficiary of an easement granted by Menasha Wooden Ware Corporation, a Wisconsin corporation ("Menasha"), as predecessor-in-interest to Fort Chicago Holdings II U.S., LLC ("FCH")<sup>1</sup>, as described in Coos County instrument volume 285, page 675, dated June 21, 1961 (the "Menasha Easement"), and as amended by correction deed recorded October 19, 1967, as microfilm reel number ("MRN") 67-10-22857; and

WHEREAS, by agreement of the parties and upon completion by Menasha of construction of a road over and across the Menasha Easement, the Menasha Easement was accepted by the County and the road constructed thereon was established the Jordan Cove County Road, as evidenced by order entered June 21, 1961, in road case no. 1039 and recorded at volume 27, page 79 of the Coos County Court Journal; and

WHEREAS, the County maintains a public road commonly known as the TransPacific Parkway<sup>2</sup> ("TPP") which as first established shared a common section or "concurrency" with Jordan Cove Road; and

WHEREAS, the County is the beneficiary of an easement granted by Weyerhaeuser Company, a Washington corporation ("Weyerhaeuser"), to the Oregon International Port of Coos Bay (the "Port") as described in Coos County instrument MRN 88-8-1424 dated August 19, 1988 for the "North Bay Industrial Park Road & Access Corridor Easement" (the "Weyerhaeuser Easement"), and assigned by

the Port to the County as described in Coos County instrument MRN 88-9-1346 dated August 19, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the County is the beneficiary of a right-of-way granted by the Port to the County as described in Coos County instrument MRN 88-9-1346 dated August 19, 2022 (the "Port Easement"); and

WHEREAS, the Weyerhaeuser Easement and the Port Easement were assigned and granted, respectively, to the County by the Port for the purposes of the TransPacific Parkway with the covenant that the county would assume jurisdiction, maintenance and control over the roadway as a county road, and the County accepted the easements as a public road; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the TPP which was originally a part of the concurrence with Jordan Cove Road was subsequently realigned north and constructed across the Weyerhaeuser Easement, and a new connection between the TPP and Jordan Cove Road was constructed across the Port Easement (the "First TPP Realignment"); and

WHEREAS, following the First TPP Realignment and on petition by Weyerhaeuser filed June 5, 1997 and recorded as MRN 97-01-1865 to 97-01-1896, Vacation file #V-539, a portion of Jordan Cove Road as described in Section C of Weyerhaeuser's Petition (MRN 97-01-1866) and depicted on the map attached thereto (MRN 97-01-1872) was vacated by Order 97-08-068L issued August 12, 1997 (MRN 97-02-006) and thereafter on August 25, 1997, a Vacation was recorded on in Vacation file V-539 (MRN 97-02-0273) and with the County Clerk (MRN 97-08-1070) (the "1997 Vacation"); and

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2005, the Board initiated proceedings to withdraw county road status<sup>3</sup> from a portion of Jordan Cove Road as described in Order 05-05-059L; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an intergovernmental agreement ("IGA") regarding the TransPacific Parkway Realignment Project ("TPP Realignment Project") between the County and the Port dated June 22, 2005, and filed at C&A #105, the Port made improvements to and realigned a portion of the TPP north of the rail spur, thereby largely eliminating the remaining concurrence between the TPP and Jordan Cove Road; and

WHEREAS, the TPP Realignment Project was completed in the fall of 2010 and the TPP in its as-built configuration has been open to public use since that time; and

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WHEREAS, as a result of the First TPP Realignment, the 1997 Vacation, and the TPP Realignment Project, Jordan Cove Road now consists of two noncontiguous sections of road as depicted on the attached Exhibit 1; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the TPP Realignment Project, portions of the TPP and the former concurrence between the TPP and Jordan Cove Road as depicted in blue on the attached Exhibit 7 have been closed to public use, and the County has discontinued maintenance of these portions of those roads but has not yet vacated those areas due to a number of factors including concerns regarding existing public utilities; and

WHEREAS, under ORS 368.341(1) the Board can initiate proceedings to vacate all or portions of a public road under ORS 368.326 to 368.366 by issuing a resolution; and

WHEREAS, surveys and legal descriptions for the portions of Jordan Cove Road and the TPP which are proposed to be vacated have been prepared and are attached hereto as Exhibit 2, Exhibit 3, Exhibit 4, Exhibit 5, and Exhibit 6; and

WHEREAS, the County Assessor has reviewed and verified the accuracy and completeness of Exhibits 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6; and

WHEREAS, the areas proposed to be vacated by Exhibits 2, 3, and 4 are generally depicted in blue on the attached Exhibit 7, and the areas proposed to be vacated by Exhibits 5 and 6 are generally indicated by red outline on the attached Exhibit 8;

# NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AND ORDERED as follows:

- 1. Proceedings to vacate portions of Jordan Cove Road and the TransPacific Parkway (collectively, "the Roads") are hereby initiated pursuant to ORS 368.341(1).
- 2. The description of the portions of the Roads proposed to be vacated are as follows:
  - a. The right-of-way described as Parcel 3 in the right-of-way deed dated June 14, 1961 and recorded in book 285 page 675, as more particularly described and depicted in the attached Exhibit 2.

- b. A portion of the right-of-way described as Parcel I in the Easement dated August 19, 1988 and recorded at MRN 88-8-1424, as more particularly described and depicted in the attached **Exhibit 3.**
- c. A portion of the right-of-way described as Parcel 2 in the right-of-way deed dated June 14, 1961 and recorded in book 285 page 675, as more particularly described and depicted in the attached **Exhibit 4.**

### COOS COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 24-04-057

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY FOR USE OF TRAILS OR STRUCTURES IN PUBLIC EASEMENTS OR UNIMPROVED RIGHTS OF WAY PROVIDED IN ORS 105.668, AS AMENDED BY SENATE BILL 1576

WHEREAS, the Coos County Board of Commissioners finds that the Oregon Legislature enacted Senate Bill (SB) 1576 in its 2024 Regular Session; and

WHEREAS, as amended by SB 1576, ORS 105.668(2) provides cities with a population of 500,000 or more with immunity from liability for injury or property damage arising from use of trail or structures in public easement or unimproved right of way; and

WHEREAS, as amended by SB 1576, ORS 105.668(3) authorizes cities and counties with populations of less than 500,000 to opt in to the immunities provided in ORS 105.668(2) by adoption of an ordinance and resolution; and

WHEREAS, Coos County desires to opt in to the immunities provided by ORS 105.668 to further advance the public interest by protecting and supporting efforts and activities of the County.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Coos County Board of Commissioners as follows:

**SECTION 1 Immunity.** Pursuant to ORS 105.668(3)(a) and (b), on behalf of the County and its elected officials, officers, employees and agents, Coos County hereby opts in to the immunity from liability for injury or property damage arising from the use of trails or structures in public easements and/or unimproved rights of way as provided by ORS 105.668.

**SECTION 2 Extended Immunity.** Pursuant to ORS 105.668(3)(c) and (d), Coos County further opts to extend the immunity adopted in Section 1 of this Resolution to:

- a. The owner(s) of land abutting public easements and unimproved right of ways located within the County; and
- b. Any nonprofit corporation and its volunteers for the construction and maintenance of trails or structures in a public easement or unimproved right of way located within the County.

**SECTION 3** Effective Date. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
