(PUBLIO - NO. 821 - 71st CONCRESS) (S. 3360) U. of O. TRACT #60

An Act Authorizing the Socretary of War to convey to the University of Oregon certain lands forming a part of the Coos Head River and Harbor ; Reservation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, That the Secretary of War is authorized and directed to convey by quitelaim deed to the University of Oregon, State of Oregon, subject to the conditions hereinafter specified, the following described part of the Coes Head River and Harbor Reservation situated on the south shore of the entrance to Coes Bay in Coes County, Oregon;

All of lot 2, the westerly soven hundred and fifty fect of lot 3, all of lot 1 excopt the west three hundred feet thereof, and all of the southwest quarter northwest quarter, except the west three hundred foot thereof, all in section 2, township 26 south, range 14 west, Willamette meridian., in the county of Coos, Oregon; excepting therefrom the parcels of land released to the Treasury Department by letter from the Assistant Socretary of War, dated April 24, 1913, and more particularly described as follows: Site for station buildings beginning at a point north forty-one degrees thirty minutos west one thousand three hundred and seven feet from the southeast corner northwest quarter of section 2, township 26 south, range 14 west, Willamette moridian; thence north thirty-three degree fifteen minutes west four hundred feet; thence west thirtythree degrees fifteen minutes south four hundred fect; thence south thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes east four hundred feet; thence east thirty-throe degrees fifteen minutes north four hundred feet to the point of beginning, and containin three and six hundred and seventy-three one-thousandths acros; also a site for 1 bont house commencing at a point seven hundred and seventy-five feet north thirt three degrees fifteen minutes west from the starting point of site and the stati grounds; thence running west thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes south one hund and fifty feet; thence south thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes east two hundr and twonty-five feat; thonce east thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes north one hundred and fifty feet; thence north thirty three degrees fifteon minutos west t hundred and twenty-five feet to the point of beginning, and containing seven hur and soventy-four one thousand the of an acre.

Soc. 2. The lands herein authorized to be conveyed shall be used by the University of Oregon solely for solentific and educational purposes subject, however, to the right of the United States, in case of war or other emergency, i assume control of, hold, use, and occupy said lands or any part thereof for any and all military, naval, or other governmental purposes, and subject at all tira to the rights of the United States stated in section 4 hereof. The deced execute ty the Secretary of War under the provisions of section 1 of this Act shall contain the express condition that if the University of Oregon shall at any time attempt to alienate said lands that same shall revert to the United States. Sec. 3. The provisions of the Act entitled "An Act authorizing the Secretary of War to grant the use of the Coes Head Military Reservation, in the State of Oregon, to the cities of Marshfield and North Bond, Oregon, both being municipal corporations, for park purposes, "approved August 21, 1910, and of an permit granted by the Secretary of War under such Act, shall not apply to the lands herein authorized to be conveyed, after the date of such conveyance, nor shall such Act or permit apply to the unconveyed part of let 3 after the day of this Act.

Sec. 4. The lands herein authorized to be conveyed to the Universit of Oregon shall at all times be subject to the right of the United States to occupy and use such part thereof as are now or may hereafter be needed for jett site or sites, for rights of way for tranways from the unconveyed part of let 3 to such harbor work; and the United States shall at all times have prior right three-fourths of the natural flow of streams draining lets 2 and 3.

### QUITCLAIN DEED - V. of O. TRACT #60

#### KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS

That I, F. H. PAYNE, ACTING SECRETARY OF WAR OF THE UNITED STATES, pursuant to and acting under the authority contained in the Act of Congress approved March 3, 1931 (46 Stat. 1506), entitled: "An Act Authorizing the Secretary of War to convey to the University of Oregon certain lands forming a part of the Coes Head River and Harber Reservation", subject to the conditions. hereinafter specified, do hereby remise, release and forever quitelaim unto the UNIVERSITY OF ONEGON, STATE OF ONEGON, all the right, title and interest of the United States in and to the following described part of the Coes Head River and Harber Reservation, situated on the south shore of the entrance to Coes Bay in Coes County, Oregon:

- All of lot 2, the westerly seven hundred and fifty feet of lot 3, all of lot 1 except the west three hundred foot thereof, and all of the southwost guarter northwest guarter, except he nest three hundred fect thereof, all in section 2, township 26 south, range 14 west, Willamette meridian, in the county of Coos, Oregon; excepting therefrom the parcels of land released to the Treasury Department by letter from the Assistant Socretary of War, dated April 24, 1913, and more particularly described as follows: Site for station buildings beginning at a point north forty-one degrees thirty minutes west one thousand three hundred and seven feet from the southeast corner northwest quarter of section 2, tomship 26 south, range 14 wost, Willamette moridian; thence north thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes west four hundred feet; thence west thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes south four hundred feat; thence south thirty-three degrees fifteen minutds east four hundred feet; thence east thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes north fou hundred feet to the point of beginning, and containing three and six hundred and seventy-three one-thousandths acros; also a site for lifeboat house commencing at point seven hundred and seventy-five feet north thirty-three degrees fifteen minutos west from the starting point of site and the station grounds; thence running west thirty-three dogroes fifteen minutes south one hundred and fifty feet; thence south thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes east two hundred and twenty-five feet; thonos east thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes north one hundred and fifty foot; thence north thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes west two hundred and twenty-five foot to the point of beginning, and containing seven hundred and seventy-four one. thousand the of an acre.

The lands herein conveyed shall be used by the University of Oregon solely for scientific and educational purposes subject, however, to the right of the United States, in case of war or other emergency, to assume control of, hold, use, and occupy said lands or any part thereof for any and all military, naval or other governmental purposes, and shall at all times be further subject to the right of the United States to occupy and use such parts thereof as are now or may hereafter be needed for jetty site or sites, for rights of way for trammays f the unconveyed part of Lot No. 3 to such jetty site or sites, and for ingress and egress by persons engaged in river and harbor work; and the United States shall a all times have prior right to three-fourths of the natural flow of streams draini Lots Nos. 2 and 3.


- A. Road # 1 (road that runs uphill from Boat Basin Rd. toward Coast Guard overlook at Coos Head (currently called Coos Head Rd, Coos Head Loop, or Chicken Loop Road... official name uncertain)
  - 1. <u>Proposed:</u> Tsunami Run Road (Justification is safety. This is the main escape route from the north side of Charleston, including OIMB, in the case of a tsunami or earthquake).
  - 2. Alternate: Marine Biology Road (field of study of the institution that owns the property on both sides of the road)
  - 3. Alternate: Rockfish Road (marine fish important in Charleston's fishing industry)
  - 4. Alternate: Coos Head Road (One version of the current name, though there may be confusion since the north-south road at the top of the hill has this same name)
- B. Access Way #1 (driveway that runs west from boat basin drive through main OIMB campus)
  - 1. <u>Proposed:</u> Plankton Drive (general name for the organisms that drift in the sea; educational juxtaposition if paired with "Benthos Lane" for Access Way #2)
  - 2. Alternate: Larva Drive (name for a baby marine animal... a major research focus of the institution)
  - 3. Alternate: Sea Star Drive (local marine animal)
- C. Access Way #2 (driveway that runs south from #1 into the main OIMB campus)
  - 1. <u>Proposed:</u> Benthos Drive (general name for organisms that live on the ocean floor; educational juxtaposition if paired with "Plankton Lane" for Access Way #1)
  - 2. Alternate: Octopus Drive (local marine animal)
  - 3. Alternate: Urchin Drive (local marine animal)
  - 4. Alternate (unless name has been used): Rockfish Drive (marine fish important in Charleston's fishing industry)


- D. Access Way #3 (driveway that runs north from #1 past OIMB cottages)
  - 1. <u>Proposed (unless name has been used)</u>: Larva Lane (name for a baby marine animal... major research focus of OIMB)


