Dear Coos County Commissioners,

Jordan Cove LNG has always been a bad choice for our area. Granting them a permit extension harms landowners on the pipeline alignment no longer approved by FERC who have already withstood 10 years of limitations on their land use and requirements to disclose the permit to buyers. Coos Bay must take the side of our community over a Canadian fossil fuel corporation by refusing extension or at least excluding landowners from any permit extension. After failing to meet state standards, Pembina has not resubmitted its applications for the approvals it would need to move forward in our state. It has even withdrawn its formal request to use the lands of the state for this project. The county must obtain a legal agreement from Pembina agreeing to obtain the Clean Water Act, the Coastal Management Act, and the department of State Lands Fill and Removal authorizations from the State of Oregon before even thinking about extending this permit.

Pembina has made a lot of false promises to this community. The jobs they've brought the area have been laid off and their offices in Coos Bay are packed up. Coos Bay needs to protect the jobs of fishermen and the tourism industry whose very lifeblood is the scenic natural splendor of our bay. Our people are and will always be more important than the profits of an out of state corporation which has done nothing but lie to us.

For the sake of our people, our environment, and our lives, please refuse to renew Pembina's permit.
