

- Significant natural features (slopes greater than 20%, geologic hazards, wetlands, drainage ways, rivers, streams, and the general location of existing trees, etc.).
- Existing easements (access, storm drainage, utility, etc.).
- Existing and proposed (structures, outbuildings, septic, etc.) on site and on adjoining properties.
- Existing and proposed road locations including widths, curbs, and sidewalks.
- Existing and proposed driveway approach locations on site, existing driveway approaches on adjoining properties on the same side of the street, and existing driveway approaches across the street from the site.
- Contiguous properties under the same ownership.
- General predevelopment topographical information (minimum 10' contour intervals).
- Location of utilities.
- If redevelopment is viable in the future, a redevelopment plan should be included.
- Preliminary site utility plan.

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




Construct appropriate ditches to prevent water runoff from discharging from the land onto a public road under county jurisdiction. Pursuant to ORS 368.256 the creation of a road hazard prohibited.

If driveway is over 1,000 ft., a pullout is required every 600 ft.

If a driveway cannot meet the maximum 18% grade then a legal agreement may be signed and recorded at the County Clerk's office releasing the County from any liability from such driveway development. This document must be referenced on the property deed to allow future purchasers know that the driveway does meet standard. A sign shall be placed at the bottom of the driveway to warn any users of the driveway that it is not built to standard. Proof must be filed with the Planning and Road Department that the documents have been filed and a sign has been placed. The form located on the following page must be completed, signed and recorded prior to any land use authorizations.

FORESTRY, MINING OR AGRICULTURAL ACCESS:

A private road which is created to provide ingress or egress in conjunction with the use of land for forestry, mining or agricultural purposes shall not be required to meet minimum road, bridge or driveway standards set forth in this ordinance, nor are such resource-related roads, bridges or driveways reviewable by the County. However, all new and re-opened forestry, mining or agricultural roads shall meet the access standards listed in this section.






Construct appropriate ditches to prevent water runoff from discharging from the land onto a road under county jurisdiction. Pursuant to ORS 368.256 creation of a road hazard is prohibited.

VISION CLEARANCE TRIANGLE:

The following regulations shall apply to all intersections of streets and roads within all districts in order to provide adequate visibility for vehicular traffic. There shall be no visual obstructions over thirty-six (36) inches in height within the clear vision area established herein. In addition to street or road intersections, the provisions of this section shall also apply to mobile home park, recreational vehicle park, and campground accesses (entrances or exists).

The clear vision area shall extend along the right-of-way of the street for a minimum of 100 feet where the speed limit is less than 35 M.P.H.; and not less than 150 feet where the speed limit is greater than 35 m.p.h. The clear vision area shall be effective from a point in the center of the access not less than 25 feet back from the street right-of-way line.
