You will be given markers, which shall be placed on each side of property you **do not wish** to be sprayed.

Maintenance of the markers is the Permittee's responsibility. Replacements for the damaged or vandalized markers are available at the Coos County Road Department with current permit number.

You must be the owner of the property or have authority to apply for this permit.

The application will be assigned a Permit Number. Reasonable precautions will be taken to avoid use of herbicides along the roadside between the clearly visible and posted markers.

<b>PERMIT AGREEMENT</b> THE APPLICANT AGREES: 1. To mark, with markers to be provided by the county, the boundaries of the roadside area not to be sprayed by county personnel.			
2.	To maintain the markers so that they are reasonably visible to the county personnel.		
3.	To keep weeds, brush, and other vegetation trimmed or removed so that the gravel road shoulder, as marked, is reasonably free from live roots and so that an area extending ten feet (10') from the roadway edge or from the roadway ditch bottom, whichever distance is less, is reasonably clear of weeds, brush and other vegetation.		
4.	If Owner fails to keep the right-of-way clear of vegetation to the satisfaction of the Roadmaster, this agreement will be revoked and the Coos County Road Department will clear the area, with the cost of such clearing charged to the Owner. Owner hereby authorizes Coos County to place a lien on the above-described property in the amount of the unpaid charges. Interest shall accrue on unpaid charges at the rate of twelve (12) percent per year.		
5.	That the applicant undertakes his/her responsibilities under this permit agreement at his/her own risk and the applicant shall indemnify Coos County, its agents and employees and hold them harmless from any and all liability for damages, costs, losses, and expenses proximately resulting from the applicant's failure to perform fully hereunder. The applicant further agrees to defend Coos County, its agents and employees, against all suits, actions, or proceedings brought by any third party against Coos County, its agents and employees which suit, action, or proceeding is brought to recover damages or other compensation for the actual negligence of the applicant in abating weeds, brush, and other vegetation in accordance with this permit agreement. In the event that the County takes any action, judicial or otherwise, to enforce this Agreement, including foreclosure of the lien authorized herein, in addition to costs and disbursements, the County shall be awarded reasonable attorney fees.		
6.	To remove expired markers by end of year. The County may remove these to avoid confusion.		
THE COUNTY AGREES:			
1.	To provide to the applicant markers for posting of roadway areas not to be sprayed by county personnel.		
2.	To refrain from spraying herbicides and related substances at and along roadsides between the visible posted markers and to take all reasonable precautions to avoid such spraying.		
3.	To inspect and approve the satisfactory abatement by the applicant of weeds, brush, and other vegetation in roadside areas not to be sprayed, and not to unreasonably withhold such approval.		
4.	To continue this permit in full force and effect until there is a substantial breach of this permit agreement by the applicant or until the full expiration date, whichever date is earlier.		
APPLICANT DECLARES HE IS THE OWNER OR LESSEE OF THE REAL PROPERTY ABUTTING THE ABOVE-DESCRIBED ROAD, HAS AN EASEMENT, OR OTHER LAWFUL AUTHORITY TO APPLY FOR THIS PERMIT. THIS PERMIT IS ISSUED SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS CONTAINED HEREIN.

## ALL MARKERS ARE TO BE INSTALLED WITHIN TEN CALENDAR DAYS FROM THE DATE ISSUED.

MAINTENANCE OF THE MARKERS IS THE PERMITTEE'S RESPONSIBILITY. REPLACEMENTS FOR DAMAGED OR VANDALIZED MARKERS ARE AVAILABLE AT THE COOS COUNTY ROAD DEPARTMENT WITH CURRENT PERMIT NUMBER.

## INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place markers on road right-of-way / property line facing centerline of road

2. Place markers on a fencepost, a sturdy pole, or some steady object (trees, buildings, mailboxes, etc. are NOT acceptable)

- 3. Place marker with "No-Spray" symbol at beginning of property or area not to be treated with herbicides. Vegetation crews will be traveling in the direction traffic flows, on the right side of the road.
- 4. Place another "No-Spray" marker at the end of property area not to be treated with herbicides.
- 5. Place marker(s) four feet above ground level. If marker(s) will be over a bank or down a slope so that it cannot be seen from the road, the marker(s) may be moved closer to the road shoulder, so that it will be four feet above the shoulder. <u>Never place a marker on shoulder or road closer than six feet to the road shoulder</u>.
- 6. Keep all weeds, brush, and other vegetation away from markers so they may be visible to the vegetation crew.

IT MAY HAPPEN THAT BOTH YOU AND YOUR NEIGHBOR PARTICIPATE IN THE "NO-SPRAY" PORTION OF COOS COUNTY'S VEGETATION MANAGEMENT PROGRAM, AND BOTH OF YOUR MARKERS WILL BE TOGETHER. IF THIS HAPPENS, BE SURE BOTH SIGNS ARE PLACED NEXT TO EACH OTHER AND ARE VISIBLE.
